Power Clan's 2019 Tour of Ireland Itinerary

Wednesday, August 07 DUBLIN ARRIVAL

At 10 a.m. transfer from Dublin Airport to nearby Glasnevin Museum. During your visit, see the final resting place of some of the most prominent people in Ireland's history. After, set off with a local guide who will show you around Dublin. The city has been molded through the centuries with many architectural styles, reflecting the economic, political and artistic influences. Stop to visit St. Patrick's Cathedral, which is almost as old as the city itself and famous for its connections with the brilliantly eccentric Dean Jonathan Swift. After your visit, you will have some time to freshen up at your hotel before tonight's festivities. This evening, enjoy dinner at a charming local venue.

Overnight: Camden Court Hotel, Dublin

Thursday, August 08 GALWAY & BUNRATTY

Leaving Dublin, journey to the bustling city of Galway, where you will join a local guide for a gentle walking tour. See the medieval city walls, Lynch's Castle and the narrow shopping streets. After your leisurely walk, continue to Ennis and check into your hotel. If time permits, you may explore some of Ennis on your own before dinner. This evening, join in the fun and feasting at Bunratty Corn Barn. Enjoy a traditionally Irish dinner as your hosts entertain you with their songs and stories.

Friday, August 09 BURREN SMOKEHOUSE & CLIFFS OF MOHER

Leaving Ennis, visit the Burren Smokehouse, a large producer of smoked fish. Next, drive to the coast of scenic County Clare to visit the rugged Cliffs of Moher, one of Ireland's most beloved, natural landmarks. See magical vistas, overlooking the shimmering Atlantic Ocean along with Ireland's Western coastline. Then, take a short ferry ride across the River Shannon Estuary before heading to the town of Listowel. Stop at John B. Keane's Pub for a drink with your group along with an informative talk on the Powers family history by Joe Power. Afterwards, drive to Dingle, where you will check into your hotel for dinner and your overnight stay.

Dinner & Overnight: Dingle Skellig Hotel, Dingle

Saturday, August 10 DINGLE PENINSULA DRIVE

After breakfast, discover the beauties of the Dingle Peninsula, once described by the National Geographic Traveler as "the most beautiful place on earth." Drive along the south shore of the peninsula for plenty of vistas of heathery mountains, sandy stretches of beach, stunning green landscapes and rocky headlands. Pause at strategic locations to admire the views and take photos. Stop to enjoy lunch with your group at a local venue before continuing on to tour Dingle Distillery, which has created a distinctive Irish twist of their own whiskey, gin and vodka. Return to Dingle for a free evening.

Overnight: Dingle Skellig Hotel, Dingle

Sunday, August 11 CAHIR CASTLE & CURRAGHMORE HOUSE

Journey from the mountainous country in Kerry through the Golden Vale, Ireland's dairy hearland into Cahir. Stop to visit Cahir Castle, stronghold of the powerful Butler family. The castle is located on an island site with buildings dating from the 13th-19th centuries. Much of the defensive walls, keep and tower are original. After, spend some time at leisure to explore the town on your own or grab an independent lunch. Later, head to the Paorach - Power Country. Continue to Portlaw so you can visit the Curraghmore House and Gardens. This stately home still belongs to the Marquis of Waterford, himself a Power descendant. Enjoy a private tour of his stately home and afterwards enjoy an informal dinner in the kitchens. From Portlaw, motor a short distance to Waterford city, where you will check into your centrally located hotel before an independent dinner.

Overnight: Granville Hotel, Waterford

Monday, August 12 DUNHILL CASTLE & WATERFORD CITY

This morning, journey the short distance to Dunhill Castle, the ancient ruin from under whose roof all Powers originate. Hear a little about the history of the castle and the Power Clan before making the journey back to Waterford for a short walking tour. Next, you may visit either the Medieval Museum or Reginald's Tower, as arranged by the Clan secretariat. In the evening, your group will be guests of honour at a Mayoral Reception given by the City of Waterford. There will also be a gala dinner with entertainment in the Garden Room of Chorister's Hall, dating from the year 1270.

Overnight: Granville Hotel, Waterford

Tuesday, August 13 NEW ROSS & GLENDALOUGH

Today, journey into the port town of New Ross to visit the Dunbrody Emigrant Ship, a replica of a sailing vessel built in 1845 to transport emigrants from Ireland to North America. The visit will give you an insight as to how tough it was for our emigrant forefathers as they left Ireland. Continue on to visit the 6th century monastic ruins of Glendalough. The visitor centre explains how St. Kevin founded this settlement at a time when Christianity was burgeoning throughout Ireland. After your visit, drive to the bustling city of Dublin and check into your hotel. You might like to relax in your room or take a short walk before tonight's festivities. In the evening, as your tour draws to a close, we'll drive to the Merry Ploughboy Pub for dinner followed by a lively show of traditional Irish songs, dancing and music.
